1. Course Registration Schedule

- Course Registration: **Aug. 13, 10:00 am (Tue.) ~ Aug. 14, 23:59 pm (Wed.)**,
- Course Change(Add & Drop): Sept. 2 (Mon.) **and** 3 (Tue.), 2019
- Course Withdrawal: Sept. 19 (Thurs.) ~ 20 (Fri), 2019
※ Students can withdraw **only one** course during the course withdrawal period.
Additional withdrawal after this period will not be possible.

This website only works with **Windows system through Internet Explorer** and requires to install Active-X control. Please note that the course registration will not work with Chrome nor Safari.

4. Course Plan

- Students are advised to take minimum of 12 credits, but there is no requirement for the minimum credits at Ajou. Please just make sure if your home university requires any minimum credits take.
- Students can take a maximum of 19 credits (usually 6 courses) and 3 credits course consists of 45-hour workload.
- To take the courses of year 3 or 4, students need to have basic knowledge of the subject.
- Exchange students must understand that course registration is highly competitive and their preferred courses are not guaranteed.

• Sports Course (1 Credit/course)
